Walkway Repairs – Walkway Repairs – The maintenance committee will begin their inspection of walkways in February for repairs to be done in the Spring. If you have a serious problem that needs attention now, please let Mill House know so we can take care of it.

Garage Doors - Several garage door openers were replaced last month. We continue to find originally installed openers that are close to failing. If you have an opener that does not have the sensor on the door, please let Mill House know so we can determine if it needs to be replaced soon. The sensors are on both sides of the track at the bottom.

Winter weather is coming and there is a possibility of losing power.

If you do not have a key to the emergency lock on your garage door, you need to have our garage door company, Open Door, 919-525-4803, install one for you. This will be at your expense.

Garage Lights – A reminder if the bulb on your exterior garage light needs replacing, please call Mill House. We will no longer replace the bulb because the screws to remove the globe are too rusty to get loose. The maintenance committee will remove the old light and install a new one. The new ones are open at the bottom so homeowners can replace the bulb.
