Walkway Repairs –The maintenance committee begins their inspection of walkways this month for repairs to be done in the Spring. Several walkways have been repaired because of vole activity and roots pushing up the bricks. If you have a serious problem that needs attention now, please let Mill House know so we can take care of it.

Garage Doors – Several garage door openers were replaced last month. We continue to find originally installed openers that are close to failing. If you have an opener that does not have the sensor on the door, please let Mill House know so we can determine if it needs to be replaced soon. The sensors are on both sides of the track at the bottom.

If you do not have a key to the emergency lock on your garage door, you need to have our garage door company, Open Door, 919-525-4803, install one for you. This will be at your expense.



Household Waste Collection

On April 20th Chatham County will collect household waste from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm across from the Main Facility at 28 County Services Road, Pittsboro, NC 27312. Residents do not need a decal but will be asked to show a NC Driver License or item with the address of where the waste is coming from. The Sheriff's Office will be on-site to conduct a medicine take back. Examples of other hazardous items collected: aerosols, solvents, and motor oil. Learn more details at their website.

Garage Lights – The Maintenance Committee replaced several garage lights this month. A reminder if the bulb on your exterior garage light needs replacing, please call Mill House. We will no longer replace the bulb if the screws are too rusty to get loose. The maintenance committee will remove the old light fixture and install a new one. The new ones are open at the bottom so homeowners can replace the bulb.

Porch Lights – Porch lights, both front and back, are the responsibility of homeowners. If your porch light is like the garage light and a bulb burns out and the rusty screws prevent it from opening, you may consider replacing the light fixture.

The Architecture Committee has approved Port Oxford 11" light fixture, model #111832. Price is \$84.97 at Home Depot.

Drainage – The Drainage Committee met this month and toured some examples of drainage issues. The committee would like to map our drainage system so we know where we might have major blockages.

Bartlett Tree Service and Logout Tree Service Contracts:

- Annual pruning and tree removal have been completed.
- GOOD NEWS! Bartlett came in \$3,500 under budget thanks to the cooperation of the residents they were able to get the crane in and out efficiently and that saved money.
- Trees assessments remain an ongoing activity.

GCU Landscaping:

- March has been a relatively quiet month with the completion of spraying winter weeds and pruning.
- Mild weather and rain mean mowing will begin soon.
- The crew has been busy cleaning up fallen branches and yard debris.

A reminder for residents to bundle the branches no more than 5 ft in length, and to put debris in paper bags, not plastic. They will not pick up piles just thrown haphazardly by the side of the road.



 For those residents wishing no pruning and/or no spraying, please request to be put on the appropriate list. In addition, a strip of black electrical tape should be applied to the house number pole just below the number. If no electrical tape is available, it's not necessary to buy a roll. Contact a member of the Landscaping Committee and we will bring it to you.

Maintenance Committee 2024

We have several projects to oversee in 2024. We will inspect the following:

- all the walkways for repair in the Spring.
- all the old garage windows to see which ones need to be replaced or painted.

If your garage window will not stay up, please let Mill House know so it can be put on the replacement list.

- all the originally installed decks to determine which ones need repair.
- all the wooden porch railings in Beechmast to check for needed repairs and painting.
